CERTIFICATION OF REPRESENTATIVES

March 28, 1942

On February 16, 1942, the National Labor Relations Board issued a Decision and Direction of Election in the above-entitled proceeding.¹ Pursuant to the Direction of Election, an election by secret ballot was conducted on March 16, 1942, under the direction and supervision of the Regional Director for the First Region (Boston, Massachusetts). On March 17, 1942, the Regional Director, acting pursuant to Article III, Section 9, of National Labor Relations Board Rules and Regulations—Series 2, as amended, issued and duly served upon the parties his Election Report. No objections to the conduct of the ballot or to the Election Report have been filed by any of the parties.

As to the balloting and its results, the Regional Director reported as follows:

IT IS HEREBY CERTIFIED that International Association of Machinists (A. F. L.) has been designated and selected by a majority of all

employees of The Atwood Machine Company, Stonington, Connecticut, excluding foremen and higher supervisory employees, clerical employees, timekeepers, carpenters, pattern makers, plant-protection employees, and all employees in the foundry and in the packing and shipping department, as their representative for the purposes of collective bargaining, and that, pursuant to Section 9 (a) of the Act, International Association of Machinists (A. F. L.) is the exclusive representative of all such employees for the purposes of collective bargaining in respect to rates of pay, wages, hours of employment, and other conditions of employment.
