AMENDMENT TO AND ORDER CORRECTING DECISION
AND DIRECTION OF ELECTIONS

October 3, 1944

On September 12, 1944, the National Labor Relations Board issued a Decision and Direction of Elections in the above-entitled proceeding.¹ In the elections directed therein among employees in the machine shop voting group and the residual voting group, the Board included upon the ballots the name of District 50, United Mine Workers of America, herein called District 50. By letter dated September 17, 1944, District 50 notified the Board that it desired that its name be withdrawn from the ballots.

The Board, accordingly, hereby amends the aforesaid Direction of Elections by striking from voting group 1, set out therein, the words, "whether they desire to be represented by United Steelworkers of America, C. I. O., or by International Association of Machinists Lodge No. 818, or by District 50, United Mine Workers of America, for the purposes of collective bargaining, or by none," and substituting therefor the words, "whether they desire to be represented by United Steelworkers of America, C. I. O., or by International Association of Machinists, Lodge No. 818, for the purposes of collective bargaining, or by neither," and by striking from voting group 2, set out in the Direction, the words, "whether they desire to be represented by United Steelworkers of America, C. I. O., or by International Molders and Foundry Workers Union, Local No. 364, or by District 50, United Mine Workers of America, for the purpose of collective bargaining, or by none," and substituting therefor the words, "whether they desire to be represented by United Steelworkers of America, C. I. O., or by International Molders and Foundry Workers Union, Local No. 364, for the purposes of collective bargaining, or by neither."

On September 27, 1944, the Company and the remaining three unions interested in voting group 1 or 2 or both, entered into a stipulation that

the Board amend the voting groups, by including machine shop inspectors in the machine shop voting group rather than in the residual voting group.² Additional facts stipulated were that the machine shop inspectors are machinists, and that supervision over them is ultimately vested in a chief machine shop inspector who is under the Company's general manager of machine shops. In view of the stipulation and the additional facts alleged, the stipulation is hereby approved and made part of the record, and the Decision and Direction of Elections will be amended accordingly.

The Decision and Direction of Elections in this proceeding, issued September 12, 1944, is hereby amended by striking "machine shop inspectors" from the list of classifications included in the residual voting group, and by inserting "machine shop inspectors" in the list of classifications included in the machine shop voting group.

The stipulation further calls to the Board's attention a typographical error with respect to the listing of "labor leader in the Molding Department" among the classifications included in the residual voting group.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Decision and Direction of Elections be, and the same hereby is, amended by striking "labor leader in the Molding Department" from the list of classifications *included* in voting group 2 under Section IV, D, and under the Direction of Elections, and by inserting "labor leader in the Molding Department" in the list of classifications *excluded* from voting group 2 under Section IV, D, and under the Direction of Elections.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Decision and Direction of Elections, as printed, shall appear as amended under the above order.
