and Procedure in Representation Cases"


You have received, under separate cover, a supply of the revised edition of "An Outline of Law and Procedure in Representation Cases." Each professional employee should receive a copy.

The revised edition incorporates the many procedural and substantive R case developments since 1974 when the manual originally issued. As a result, it should prove to be a valuable desk reference when R case issues arise, as well as a foundation for R case research. For example, Chapter One will be particularly useful in researching questions of jurisdiction. Note also that the manual now contains cross-references to the Agency's Classified Index of National Labor Relations Board Decisions and Related Court Decisions. This new feature should further enhance its value as a research tool.

This project reflects the work of many individuals, all of whom can take pride in the final product. Special recognition goes to the Board's Solicitor, John E. Higgins, Jr., and the many individuals from the Agency's field offices who reviewed individual chapters and offered suggestions and comments. This input was highly valuable and is much appreciated. Deputy Assistant General Counsel Celeste J. Mattina and Deputy to the Assistant General Counsel Dana L. Hesse in the Division of Operations-Management coordinated the field review. Herbert E. Weiser, Head of the Legal Retrieval and Publication Section, Division of Advice, prepared the cross-references to the Classified Index.
