CONTINUING CASE UNDER 29 U.S.C.
SECTION 160(j)**

22 IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED AND AGREED by and between the Petitioner,
23 Joseph Frankl, Regional Director of Region 20 of the National Labor Relations Board
24 (Petitioner) for and on behalf of the National Labor Relations Board (Board) and the
25 Respondent, Bauer's Intelligent Transportation (Respondent), by their respective
26 attorneys and subject to the approval of the Court, that:


1 such likelihood of success exists that Respondent has failed to comply with the
2 undertakings described in paragraphs 3 or 4, above; and

3 (b) if the Court concludes that such likelihood of success as alleged by
4 Petitioner does exist, Respondent shall not contest that interim injunctive relief is
5 otherwise just and proper and the Court shall enter a temporary injunctive order to require
6 Respondent, pending the Board's approval of the settlement agreement of NLRB Cases
7 20-CA-148119 and 20-CA-151225 to cease and desist from the conduct as described in
8 paragraph 3, above, and to comply with the affirmative conduct described in paragraph 4,
9 above.

1 6. Unless the provisions of paragraph 5, above are invoked by Petitioner, this
2 case shall remain on the inactive docket of the Court pending the Board's final
3 approval of the settlement agreement of NLRB Cases 20-CA-148119 and 20-CA-
4 151225. After the Board's final approval of the settlement agreement in these unfair
5 labor practice cases, currently pending before the Board, Petitioner shall cause this
6 proceeding, including any injunctive order issued by the Court pursuant to the
7 provisions of paragraph 5, above, to be dismissed with prejudice and without costs to
8 either party.
