UNOPPOSED MOTION OF THE NATIONAL LABOR RELATIONS BOARD FOR A 21-DAY EXTENSION OF TIME

To the Honorable, the Judges of the United States Court of Appeals for Fifth Circuit:

The National Labor Relations Board ("the Board"), by its Deputy Associate General Counsel, respectfully moves this Court for a 21-day extension of time to submit its brief, to and including November 1, 2016. In support of its motion, the Board shows as follows:

- 1. Jack in the Box, Inc. ("the Company"), filed its opening brief on September 6, 2016. Pursuant to the Court's scheduling order, the Board's responsive brief is due October 11, 2016.
- 2. Jared Cantor, the briefing attorney assigned to this case, is presently preparing for oral argument on September 28 in *UAW v. NLRB*, Nos. 15-2305 &

15-2478 (6th Cir.), in Cincinnati, Ohio. Previously, Attorney Cantor filed a brief in *NLRB v. Lily Transportation, Inc.*, No. 15-2398 (1st Cir.) (brief filed September 20, 2016), and presented oral argument in *HealthBridge Management, LLC v. NLRB*, Nos. 15-1110 & 15-1129 (D.C. Cir.), on September 12, 2016. Attorney Cantor is also involved in an ongoing confidential mediation in the Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit, and has planned leave in early October to attend services for the Jewish High Holy Days. Kira Dellinger Vol, the supervisory attorney assigned to this case, has significant responsibilities in other cases, including supervising the preparation of the Board's brief in *Prime Healthcare Paradise v. NLRB*, D.C. Cir. Nos. 16-1132, 16-1173 (brief due October 11, 2016), and previously supervised the Board's brief in *Lily Transportation*, *supra*.

- 3. Due to Board counsels' above-described commitments, it will not be possible for Board counsel, with due diligence and giving priority to the preparation and editing of the brief, to file the brief by its current due date. The Board has not previously requested an extension of time. The Board therefore requests an additional 21 days, until Tuesday, November 1, 2016, to file its brief.
- 4. Counsel for the Company has represented to the Board that it does not oppose such an extension.

WHEREFORE, the Board respectfully requests that the Court grant a 21-day extension of the due date of the Board's brief, to and including November 1, 2016.
