**MOTION TO TRANSFER PROCEEDINGS TO THE
BOARD AND MOTION FOR DEFAULT JUDGMENT**

Pursuant to Section 102.24 and 102.50 of the National Labor Relations Board Rules and Regulations and Statement of Standard Procedures, Series 8, as amended, herein called the Rules, the General Counsel respectfully moves that the National Labor Relations Board, herein referred to as the Board: (1) transfer this case and continue proceedings before the Board; (2) deem the allegations set forth in the Complaint issued on September 30, 2016, as admitted to be true without taking evidence supporting the allegations in the Complaint; and (3) grant Default Judgment and issue a Decision and Order herein on the basis of the following:

1. On May 19, 2016, Governed United Security Professionals (the Union) filed a charge in Case 5-CA-176516 alleging that Frontline Security Services (Respondent) has been violating Section 8(a)(1) and (5) of the National Labor Relations Act (the Act). The charge was duly served on Respondent by mail on May 20, 2016. A copy of the charge is attached as **Exhibit 1**, and a copy of the transmittal letter (without enclosures), including the affidavit of service, is attached as **Exhibit 2**.

2. On September 30, 2016, the Regional Director issued, by certified United States mail, a Complaint alleging that Respondent violated Section 8(a)(1) and (5) of the Act by:

(a) Failing to furnish information requested by the Union that was relevant to its duties as exclusive collective-bargaining representative of Respondent's employees; and

(b) Modifying the collective-bargaining agreement between Respondent and the Union by failing to provide health benefits without the Union's consent.

Copies of the Complaint and affidavit of service are attached as **Exhibits 3 and 4**.

3. The Regional Director served the Complaint by sending it via certified mail to the last known address of Respondent's office. An email from Respondent's Chief Executive Officer Devonne Edwards dated July 22, 2016, which is attached as **Exhibit 5**, lists this address. United States Postal Service ("USPS") tracking, which is attached as **Exhibit 6**, shows that the Complaint was forwarded from Respondent's last known office address to a new address. It went unclaimed despite notice being left at the forwarded address. Under Board precedent, service "is accomplished by deposit in the mail to the last known address of a respondent." *New Jersey State Opera*, 363 NLRB No. 152, slip op. at 1 fn.4 (2017) (citing *National Automatic Sprinklers, Inc.*, 307 NLRB 481, 481 fn.1 (1992)).

4. The Regional Director additionally served the Complaint by sending it via certified mail to the address of Respondent's resident agent in Maryland, Devonne O. Edwards, as listed by the Maryland Department of Assessments and Taxation. A copy of this listing, attached as **Exhibit 7**, continues to show the same address for the resident agent of Respondent in Maryland as of March 17, 2017. USPS tracking, which is attached as **Exhibit 8**, shows that the Complaint went unclaimed despite notice being left at this address. "[T]he Board has long held that a respondent's failure or refusal to claim certified mail or to provide for receiving appropriate service will not be permitted to defeat the purposes of the Act." *SMC Engineering & Contracting, Inc.*, 324 NLRB 341, 341-42 (1997) (citing *Advanced Mechanical Corp.*, 313 NLRB 629, 629 fn. 1 (1994); *Michigan Expediting Service*, 282 NLRB 210 fn. 6 (1986)).

5. The Regional Director sent a courtesy copy of the Complaint by regular mail to Respondent's counsel. See Exhibit 4.

6. Section 102.20 of the Rules requires the Respondent to file an answer within 14 days of service of the Regional Director's Complaint. Accordingly, the Complaint states that Respondent shall file an answer to the Complaint by October 14, 2016. The Complaint also notified Respondent that, absent timely answer, the Board may find the allegations in the Complaint to be true. Respondent did not file an answer by October 14, 2016.

7. By letter dated October 18, 2016, Respondent's counsel was advised by the Regional Attorney that Respondent had not filed an answer to the Complaint, and that, absent the filing of an answer to the Complaint by October 25, 2016, a Motion for Default Judgment would be filed. A copy of the Regional Attorney's October 18, 2016 letter to Respondent and proof of receipt are attached as **Exhibits 9 and 10**.

8. As of March 23, 2017, no answer has been filed and Respondent has given no satisfactory reason for its failure to do so.

WHEREFORE, counsel for the General Counsel respectfully requests, in accordance with Sections 102.24 and 102.50 of the Board's Rules and Regulations, that the Board deem all matters alleged in the Complaint to be true, and that they be so found, and that a Decision and Order be issued containing findings of fact, conclusions of law, and an appropriate remedy for the violations herein.



This letter tells you how to contact the Board agent who will be investigating the charge, explains your right to be represented, discusses presenting your evidence, and provides a brief explanation of our procedures, including how to submit documents to the NLRB.

Investigator: This charge is being investigated by Field Attorney Thomas Murphy whose telephone number is (410) 962-2538. If this Board agent is not available, you may contact Supervisory Field Attorney Linda Crovella whose telephone number is (202) 208-3040.

Right to Representation: You have the right to be represented by an attorney or other representative in any proceeding before us. If you choose to be represented, your representative must notify us in writing of this fact as soon as possible by completing Form NLRB-4701, Notice of Appearance. This form is available on our website, www.nlr.gov, or from an NLRB office upon your request.

If you are contacted by someone about representing you in this case, please be assured that no organization or person seeking your business has any "inside knowledge" or favored relationship with the National Labor Relations Board. Their knowledge regarding this proceeding was only obtained through access to information that must be made available to any member of the public under the Freedom of Information Act.

Presentation of Your Evidence: We seek prompt resolutions of labor disputes. Therefore, I urge you or your representative to submit a complete written account of the facts and a statement of your position with respect to the allegations set forth in the charge as soon as possible. If the Board agent later asks for more evidence, I strongly urge you or your representative to cooperate fully by promptly presenting all evidence relevant to the investigation. In this way, the case can be fully investigated more quickly.

Full and complete cooperation includes providing witnesses to give sworn affidavits to a Board agent, and providing all relevant documentary evidence requested by the Board agent. Sending us your written account of the facts and a statement of your position is not enough to be

considered full and complete cooperation. A refusal to fully cooperate during the investigation might cause a case to be litigated unnecessarily.

In addition, either you or your representative must complete the enclosed Commerce Questionnaire to enable us to determine whether the NLRB has jurisdiction over this dispute. If you recently submitted this information in another case, or if you need assistance completing the form, please contact the Board agent.

We will not honor any request to place limitations on our use of position statements or evidence beyond those prescribed by the Freedom of Information Act and the Federal Records Act. Thus, we will not honor any claim of confidentiality except as provided by Exemption 4 of FOIA, 5 U.S.C. Sec. 552(b)(4), and any material you submit may be introduced as evidence at any hearing before an administrative law judge. We are also required by the Federal Records Act to keep copies of documents gathered in our investigation for some years after a case closes. Further, the Freedom of Information Act may require that we disclose such records in closed cases upon request, unless there is an applicable exemption. Examples of those exemptions are those that protect confidential financial information or personal privacy interests.

Procedures: We strongly urge everyone to submit all documents and other materials by E-Filing (not e-mailing) through our website, www.nlr.gov. However, the Agency will continue to accept timely filed paper documents. Please include the case name and number indicated above on all your correspondence regarding the charge.

Information about the Agency, the procedures we follow in unfair labor practice cases and our customer service standards is available on our website, www.nlr.gov or from an NLRB office upon your request. NLRB Form 4541 offers information that is helpful to parties involved in an investigation of an unfair labor practice charge.

COMPLAINT AND NOTICE OF HEARING

This Complaint and Notice of Hearing is based on a charge filed by Governed United Security Professionals (the Charging Party). It is issued pursuant to Section 10(b) of the National Labor Relations Act (the Act), 29 U.S.C. § 151 et seq., and Section 102.15 of the Rules and Regulations of the National Labor Relations Board (the Board) and alleges that Frontline Security Services (Respondent) has violated the Act as described below.

1. The charge in this proceeding was filed by the Charging Party on May 18, 2016, and a copy was served on Respondent by U.S. mail on May 20, 2016.

2. (a) At all material times, Respondent has been a limited liability company with an office and a place of business at the Social Security Administration National Support Center in Urbana, Maryland, and has been engaged in the business of providing security services to state and federal agencies.

(b) In conducting its operations during the 12-month period ending August 30, 2016, Respondent performed services valued in excess of \$50,000 in states other than the State of Maryland.

(c) At all material times, Respondent has been an employer engaged in commerce within the meaning of Section 2(2), (6), and (7) of the Act.

3. At all material times, the Charging Party has been a labor organization within the meaning of Section 2(5) of the Act.

4. At all material times, the following individuals held the positions set forth opposite their respective names and have been supervisors of Respondent within the meaning of Section 2(11) of the Act and agents of Respondent within the meaning of Section 2(13) of the Act:

Devonne Edwards	-	President
Judith Welch	-	Director of Human Resources
Jamal Young	-	Project Manager

5. (a) The following employees of Respondent (the Unit) constitute a unit appropriate for the purposes of collective bargaining within the meaning of Section 9(b) of the Act:

All full-time and regular part-time security officers and sergeants employed by the Employer at the Social Security Administration National Support Center currently located in Urbana, Maryland; but excluding all lieutenants, captains, office clerical employees, professional employees, managerial employees, and supervisors as defined by the Act.

(b) On October 14, 2014, the Board certified the Charging Party as the exclusive collective-bargaining representative of the Unit.

(c) At all times since October 14, 2014, based on Section 9(a) of the Act, the Charging Party has been the exclusive collective-bargaining representative of the Unit.

6. (a) Since about late January 2016, the Charging Party has requested, orally, that Respondent furnish the Charging Party with proof of health insurance coverage for Unit employees.

(b) Since about February 2016, the Charging Party has requested, orally, that Respondent furnish the Charging Party with certified payrolls.

(c) The information requested by the Charging Party, as described above in paragraphs 6(a) and 6(b), is necessary for, and relevant to, the Charging Party's performance of its duties as the exclusive collective-bargaining representative of the Unit.

(d) Since about late January 2016, Respondent has failed and refused to furnish the Charging Party with the information requested by it as described above in paragraph 6(a).

(e) Since about February 2016, Respondent has failed and refused to furnish the Charging Party with the information requested by it as described above in paragraph 6(b).

7. (a) About July 1, 2015, the Charging Party entered into a collective-bargaining agreement with Respondent, effective from July 2015 through June 2018.

(b) The collective-bargaining agreement described above in paragraph 7(a) contains an article, Article 11, pertaining to the health and welfare benefits for employees in the Unit.

(c) Since about January 1, 2016, Respondent has failed to continue in effect all the terms and conditions of the agreement described in paragraph 7(a) by failing to provide health benefits to employees in the Unit under the terms of Article 11.

(d) The terms and conditions of employment described above in paragraph 7(c) are mandatory subjects for the purposes of collective bargaining.

(e) Respondent engaged in the conduct described above in paragraph 7(c) without the Charging Party's consent.

8. (a) By the conduct described above in paragraphs 6(d) and 6(e), Respondent has been failing and refusing to bargain collectively with the exclusive collective-bargaining representative of its employees in violation of Section 8(a)(1) and (5) of the Act.

(b) By the conduct described above in paragraphs 7(c) through 7(e), Respondent has been failing and refusing to bargain collectively with the exclusive collective-bargaining representative of its employees within the meaning of Section 8(d) of the Act in violation of Section 8(a)(1) and (5) of the Act.

9. The unfair labor practices of Respondent described above affect commerce within the meaning of Section 2(6) and (7) of the Act.

ANSWER REQUIREMENT

Respondent is notified that, pursuant to Sections 102.20 and 102.21 of the Board's Rules and Regulations, it must file an answer to the complaint. The answer must be **received by this office on or before October 14, 2016, or postmarked on or before October 13, 2016.**

Respondent should file an original and four copies of the answer with this office and serve a copy of the answer on each of the other parties.

An answer may also be filed electronically through the Agency's website. To file electronically, go to www.nlr.gov, click on **E-File Documents**, enter the NLRB Case Number, and follow the detailed instructions. The responsibility for the receipt and usability of the answer rests exclusively upon the sender. Unless notification on the Agency's website informs users that the Agency's E-Filing system is officially determined to be in technical failure because it is

unable to receive documents for a continuous period of more than 2 hours after 12:00 noon (Eastern Time) on the due date for filing, a failure to timely file the answer will not be excused on the basis that the transmission could not be accomplished because the Agency's website was off-line or unavailable for some other reason. The Board's Rules and Regulations require that an answer be signed by counsel or non-attorney representative for represented parties or by the party if not represented. See Section 102.21. If the answer being filed electronically is a pdf document containing the required signature, no paper copies of the answer need to be transmitted to the Regional Office. However, if the electronic version of an answer to a complaint is not a pdf file containing the required signature, then the E-filing rules require that such answer containing the required signature continue to be submitted to the Regional Office by traditional means within three (3) business days after the date of electronic filing. Service of the answer on each of the other parties must still be accomplished by means allowed under the Board's Rules and Regulations. The answer may not be filed by facsimile transmission. If no answer is filed, or if an answer is filed untimely, the Board may find, pursuant to a Motion for Default Judgment, that the allegations in the complaint are true.

NOTICE OF HEARING

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE THAT on January 24, 2017, at 10:00 a.m., at The Board Hearing Room, Suite 6001, 1015 Half Street, SE, Washington, DC, and on consecutive days thereafter until concluded, a hearing will be conducted before an administrative law judge of the National Labor Relations Board. At the hearing, Respondent and any other party to this proceeding have the right to appear and present testimony regarding the allegations in this

complaint. The procedures to be followed at the hearing are described in the attached Form NLRB-4668. The procedure to request a postponement of the hearing is described in the attached Form NLRB-4338.
