**COUNSEL FOR GENERAL COUNSEL'S REQUEST FOR AN EXTENSION OF
PAGE LIMITS FOR ANSWERING BRIEF IN OPPOSITION TO RESPONDENT'S
EXCEPTIONS**

Counsel for General Counsel, pursuant to Section 102.46 of the Board's Rules and Regulations, hereby requests permission to file its Answering Brief in Opposition to Respondent's Exceptions in excess of fifty pages. In support of this request, Counsel for General Counsel states:

1. On August 16, 2018, Administrative Law Judge Ira Sandron filed his decision in the present case, finding in the Board's favor. On September 12, 2018, one day before its exceptions were due, Respondent filed for an extension of the page limit in support of exceptions, which was partially granted on September 13, 2018, extending the page limit to 75 pages. That same day, September 13, the parties entered into the Board's Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR) program. On December 14, 2018, this case was removed from the ADR program. Respondent filed its exceptions and brief in support of exceptions on Friday, December 28, 2018.

2. On January 4, 2018, General Counsel submitted a request for a 14-day extension of time to file its Brief in Opposition to Respondent's Exceptions. The extension was granted on January 7, 2018, so that General Counsel's Brief in Opposition to Respondent's Exceptions is due on January 25, 2019.


3. Judge Sandron's decision is thirty single-spaced pages, summarizing ten days of hearing. The transcript contains over 1,200 pages, including the testimony of 30 witnesses and 119 exhibits. Respondent submitted 121 separate exceptions to the Judge's decision and a 75 page supporting brief.

4. General Counsel requests to file a brief not in excess of 75 pages. Such a brief is required to address Respondent's numerous exceptions and the Judge's lengthy decision.

For the reasons stated above, Counsel for General Counsel respectfully requests to file an Answering Brief in Opposition to Respondent's Exceptions not in excess of 75 pages commensurate with the extension granted to Respondent.


