**ORDER GRANTING GENERAL COUNSEL'S
UNOPPOSED MOTION TO EXTEND DUE DATE FOR
MOTIONS TO REOPEN RECORD**

On April 25, 2019, counsel for the General Counsel moved to extend the due date for the parties to file motions to reopen the record. Counsel moved to extend time to respond to my Order Based on Remand where I asked the parties how they wanted to proceed on a work rule allegation remanded by the National Labor Relations Board (the Board or NLRB) in light of the new standards for analyzing an employer's work rules announced in *The Boeing Company*, 365 NLRB No. 154 (Dec. 14, 2017).

As grounds for her motion, counsel for the General Counsel avers that she needs a two-week extension of the deadline dates in order to consult with and receive guidance from the Board's Division of Advice on the General Counsel's position regarding the remanded allegation. Phillips 66 (Respondent) and United Steel, Paper and Forestry, Rubber, Manufacturing, Energy, Allied Industrial & Service Workers International Union, AFL-CIO/CLC (Charging Party or the Union) did not oppose the General Counsel's extension request.

Accordingly, with good cause having been shown, the General Counsel's request for a two-week extension of the filing deadline to file any motions to reopen the record is hereby **GRANTED**.

It is **ORDERED** that if the General Counsel intends to file a motion to withdraw the remanded work rule allegation, the deadline to file said motion is extended to **11:59 p.m. Pacific Time on May 14, 2019**.

The deadline to file a motion to reopen the record for the purpose of offering any new evidence regarding the lawfulness of the aforementioned rule in light of the holding in *Boeing* is extended to **11:59 p.m. Pacific Time on May 21, 2019**.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that any opposition brief to a party's motion to reopen the record is extended to **11:59 p.m. Pacific Time on May 28, 2019.**
