**MOTION TO TRANSFER AND CONTINUE CASE
BEFORE THE NATIONAL LABOR RELATIONS BOARD
AND MOTION FOR DEFAULT JUDGMENT AND FOR ISSUANCE
OF BOARD DECISION AND ORDER**

Counsel for General Counsel (Counsel), pursuant to Sections 102.20, 102.24, and 102.50 of the National Labor Relations Board's (Board) Rules and Regulations, moves that the proceedings in the above-captioned case be transferred to the Board for a final determination on the basis of the pleadings previously filed. Attached to this Motion as exhibits, and incorporated herein by reference, are copies of the Complaint and Notice of Hearing (Complaint) and other relevant documents described below.

Counsel further moves that, upon transfer of the proceedings to the Board, the Board issue an appropriate order to show cause why this motion should not be granted, and that unless Conventions Unlimited, Inc. d/b/a Convention Services of Louisiana (Respondent) show good cause for failing to file an answer within the time specified by Section 102.20 of the Board's Rules and Regulations, all the allegations contained in the Complaint be deemed to be admitted

true and an order entered providing for an appropriate remedy, without the holding of a hearing and/or without taking evidence in support of the allegations in the Complaint.

In support of this Motion, Counsel alleges and shows as follows:

1. On March 29, 2019, Regional Director M. Kathleen McKinney issued the Complaint in Case 15-CA-230783 alleging that Respondent failed and refused to provide necessary and relevant information requested by the International Alliance of Theatrical Stage Employees and Moving Picture Technicians, Artists and Allied Crafts of the United States and Canada, AFL-CIO, Local 39 (Union). A copy of the Complaint was served by certified mail on Respondent at Post Office Box 7945, Metairie, Louisiana 70010-7945 (certified receipt number 7016 2070 0000 4520 7631). The Complaint and Affidavit of Service are attached as Exhibit 1. Although no postal return receipt card has been received by Counsel at this time, a copy of the United States Postal Service's computer-generated tracking confirmation showing that delivery of the mail with certified receipt number 7016 2070 0000 4520 7631 was made on April 2, 2019, is attached hereto and marked as Exhibit 2. Respondent did not file an answer to the Complaint.

2. On April 18, 2019, the Regional Attorney, on behalf of Regional Director M. Kathleen McKinney, sent a letter by certified mail to Respondent at Post Office Box 7945, Metairie, Louisiana 70010-7945 (certified receipt number 7016 2070 0000 8750 4791). The letter stated the time limits for filing an answer to the Complaint had expired and requested an answer from Respondent. A copy of the April 18, 2019, letter is attached as Exhibit 3. Although no postal return receipt card has been received by Counsel at this time, a copy of the United States Postal Service's computer-generated tracking confirmation showing that delivery of the mail with certified receipt number 7016 2070 0000 8750 4791 was made on April 23, 2019, is attached hereto and marked as Exhibit 4.

3. On April 19, 2019, Regional Director M. Kathleen McKinney sent a corrected letter by certified mail to Respondent at Post Office Box 7945, Metairie, Louisiana 70010-7945 (certified receipt number 7016 2070 0000 8750 7600). The letter stated the time limits for filing an answer to the Complaint had expired and requested an answer from Respondent. A copy of the April 19, 2019, letter is attached as Exhibit 5. Although no postal return receipt card has been received by Counsel at this time, a copy of the United States Postal Service's computer-generated tracking confirmation showing that delivery of the mail with certified receipt number 7016 2070 0000 8750 7600 was made on April 23, 2019, is attached hereto and marked as Exhibit 6.

4. To date, no answer to the Complaint has been filed.

5. Section 102.20 of the Board's Rules and Regulations, provides as follows:

The respondent shall, within 14 days from the service of the complaint, file an answer thereto. The respondent shall specifically admit, deny, or explain each of the facts alleged in the complaint, unless the respondent is without knowledge, in which case the respondent shall so state, such statement operating as a denial. All allegations in the complaint, if no answer is filed, or any allegation in the complaint not specifically denied or explained in an answer filed, unless the respondent shall state in the answer that he is without knowledge, shall be deemed to be admitted to be true and shall be so found by the Board, unless good cause to the contrary is shown.

6. Respondent, having been duly served, has failed and refused to file an answer to the Complaint. Therefore, all allegations in the Complaint must be deemed admitted as true and no issue of fact exists warranting or requiring a hearing.

Accordingly, Counsel submits the matter is appropriate for final determination upon default judgment without a hearing and that a final order should be entered in accordance with the allegations of the Complaint, without taking evidence or giving Respondents further notice.



COMPLAINT AND NOTICE OF HEARING

This Complaint and Notice of Hearing is based on a charge filed by International Alliance of Theatrical Stage Employees and Moving Picture Technicians, Artists and Allied Crafts of the United States and Canada, AFL-CIO (IATSE), Local 39 (Union). It is issued pursuant to Section 10(b) of the National Labor Relations Act (the Act), 29 U.S.C. § 151 et seq., and Section 102.15 of the Rules and Regulations of the National Labor Relations Board (the Board) and alleges that Conventions Unlimited, Inc. d/b/a Convention Services of Louisiana (Respondent) has violated the Act as described below.

1(a) The charge in this proceeding was filed by the Union on November 8, 2018, and a copy was served on Respondent by U.S. mail on November 9, 2018.

(b) The first amended charge in this proceeding was filed by the Union on January 31, 2019, and a copy was served on Respondent by U.S. mail on the same day.



2. At all material times, Respondent has been a corporation with an office and place of business in River Ridge, Louisiana, and has been engaged in the installation, dismantling, and maintenance of convention display materials.

3(a) During the 12-month period ending March 25, 2019, Respondent provided services valued in excess of \$50,000 for Rodan & Fields, LLC, within the State of Louisiana.

(b) At all material times, Rodan & Fields, LLC has been a corporation with an office and place of business in San Francisco, California, and has been engaged in the manufacture and sale of skincare products.

(c) Annually, Rodan & Fields, LLC sold and shipped from its San Francisco, California, facility goods valued in excess of \$50,000 directly to points outside the State of California.

(d) Annually, Rodan & Fields, LLC purchased and received at its San Francisco, California facility goods valued in excess of \$50,000 directly from points outside the State of California.

(e) Rodan & Fields, LLC is an enterprise directly engaged in interstate commerce.

4. At all material times, Respondent has been an employer engaged in commerce within the meaning of Section 2(2), (6), and (7) of the Act.

5. At all material times, the Union has been a labor organization within the meaning of Section 2(5) of the Act.

6. At all material times, Donald Fisk held the position of Respondent's President and has been an agent of Respondent within the meaning of Section 2(13) of the Act.

7(a) The following employees of Respondent (the Unit) constitute a unit appropriate for the purposes of collective bargaining within the meaning of Section 9(b) of the Act:

All employees furnished by the Union to Respondent who perform services in connection with the installation, dismantling, and maintenance of convention decorations, exhibits and facilities, display booths, freight work and all related work.

(b) Since about July 1, 2014, and at all material times, Respondent has recognized the Union as the exclusive collective-bargaining representative of the Unit. This recognition has been embodied in a recognition agreement dated July 1, 2014.

8(a) Since about September 14, 2018, the Union has requested verbally that Respondent furnish the Union with the following information: Respondent's check registry for the September 2018 Rodan & Fields show.

(b) Since about October 5, 2018, the Union has requested, in writing, that Respondent furnish the Union with the following information: Respondent's check registry and time sheets for the September 2018 Rodan & Fields, LLC show.

(c) Since about October 22, 2018, the Union has requested, in writing, that Respondent furnish the Union with the following information: Respondent's check registries and daily time sheets for all shows at which the Union provided Respondent with employees from 2014 to the present.

(d) The information requested by the Union, as described above in paragraphs 8(a), (b), and (c), is necessary for, and relevant to, the Union's performance of its duties as the exclusive collective-bargaining representative of the Unit.

9. Since about October 22, 2018, Respondent has failed and refused to furnish the Union with the information requested by it as described above in paragraph 8.

10. By the conduct described above in paragraph 9, Respondent has been failing and refusing to bargain collectively and in good faith with the exclusive collective-bargaining representative of its employees in violation of Section 8(a)(1) and (5) of the Act.

11. The unfair labor practices of Respondent described above affect commerce within the meaning of Section 2(6) and (7) of the Act.

ANSWER REQUIREMENT

Respondent is notified that, pursuant to Sections 102.20 and 102.21 of the Board's Rules and Regulations, it must file an answer to the complaint. The answer must be **received by this office on or before April 12, 2019, or postmarked on or before April 11, 2019.** Respondent should file an original and four copies of the answer with this office and serve a copy of the answer on each of the other parties.

An answer may also be filed electronically through the Agency's website. To file electronically, go to www.nlr.gov, click on **E-File Documents**, enter the NLRB Case Number, and follow the detailed instructions. The responsibility for the receipt and usability of the answer rests exclusively upon the sender. Unless notification on the Agency's website informs users that the Agency's E-Filing system is officially determined to be in technical failure because it is unable to receive documents for a continuous period of more than 2 hours after 12:00 noon (Eastern Time) on the due date for filing, a failure to timely file the answer will not be excused on the basis that the transmission could not be accomplished because the Agency's website was off-line or unavailable for some other reason. The Board's Rules and Regulations require that an answer be signed by counsel or non-attorney representative for represented parties or by the party if not represented. See Section 102.21. If the answer being filed electronically is a pdf document containing the required signature, no paper copies of the answer need to be transmitted to the Regional Office. However, if the electronic version of an answer to a complaint is not a pdf file containing the required signature, then the E-filing rules require that such answer containing the required signature continue to be submitted to the Regional Office by traditional means within three (3) business days after the date of electronic filing. Service of the answer on each of the other parties

must still be accomplished by means allowed under the Board's Rules and Regulations. The answer may not be filed by facsimile transmission. If no answer is filed, or if an answer is filed untimely, the Board may find, pursuant to a Motion for Default Judgment, that the allegations in the complaint are true.

NOTICE OF HEARING

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE THAT on **July 22, 2019, at 10:00 a.m. in Courtroom, National Labor Relations Board, Region 15, 600 S Maestri Place, 7th Floor, New Orleans, Louisiana**], and on consecutive days thereafter until concluded, a hearing will be conducted before an administrative law judge of the National Labor Relations Board. At the hearing, Respondent and any other party to this proceeding have the right to appear and present testimony regarding the allegations in this complaint. The procedures to be followed at the hearing are described in the attached Form NLRB-4668. The procedure to request a postponement of the hearing is described in the attached Form NLRB-4338.

The issuance of the notice of formal hearing in this case does not mean that the matter cannot be disposed of by agreement of the parties. On the contrary, it is the policy of this office to encourage voluntary adjustments. The examiner or attorney assigned to the case will be pleased to receive and to act promptly upon your suggestions or comments to this end.

An agreement between the parties, approved by the Regional Director, would serve to cancel the hearing. However, unless otherwise specifically ordered, the hearing will be held at the date, hour, and place indicated. Postponements *will not be granted* unless good and sufficient grounds are shown *and* the following requirements are met:

- (1) The request must be in writing. An original and two copies must be filed with the Regional Director when appropriate under 29 CFR 102.16(a) or with the Division of Judges when appropriate under 29 CFR 102.16(b).
- (2) Grounds must be set forth in *detail*;
- (3) Alternative dates for any rescheduled hearing must be given;
- (4) The positions of all other parties must be ascertained in advance by the requesting party and set forth in the request;
and
- (5) Copies must be simultaneously served on all other parties (listed below), and that fact must be noted on the request.

Except under the most extreme conditions, no request for postponement will be granted during the three days immediately preceding the date of hearing.

Procedures in NLRB Unfair Labor Practice Hearings

The attached complaint has scheduled a hearing that will be conducted by an administrative law judge (ALJ) of the National Labor Relations Board who will be an independent, impartial finder of facts and applicable law. **You may be represented at this hearing by an attorney or other representative.** If you are not currently represented by an attorney, and wish to have one represent you at the hearing, you should make such arrangements as soon as possible. A more complete description of the hearing process and the ALJ's role may be found at Sections 102.34, 102.35, and 102.45 of the Board's Rules and Regulations. The Board's Rules and regulations are available at the following link: www.nlr.gov/sites/default/files/attachments/basic-page/node-1717/rules_and_regs_part_102.pdf.

The NLRB allows you to file certain documents electronically and you are encouraged to do so because it ensures that your government resources are used efficiently. To e-file go to the NLRB's website at www.nlr.gov, click on "e-file documents," enter the 10-digit case number on the complaint (the first number if there is more than one), and follow the prompts. You will receive a confirmation number and an e-mail notification that the documents were successfully filed.

Although this matter is set for trial, this does not mean that this matter cannot be resolved through a settlement agreement. The NLRB recognizes that adjustments or settlements consistent with the policies of the National Labor Relations Act reduce government expenditures and promote amity in labor relations and encourages the parties to engage in settlement efforts.

I. BEFORE THE HEARING

The rules pertaining to the Board's pre-hearing procedures, including rules concerning filing an answer, requesting a postponement, filing other motions, and obtaining subpoenas to compel the attendance of witnesses and production of documents from other parties, may be found at Sections 102.20 through 102.32 of the Board's Rules and Regulations. In addition, you should be aware of the following:

- **Special Needs:** If you or any of the witnesses you wish to have testify at the hearing have special needs and require auxiliary aids to participate in the hearing, you should notify the Regional Director as soon as possible and request the necessary assistance. Assistance will be provided to persons who have handicaps falling within the provisions of Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended, and 29 C.F.R. 100.603.
- **Pre-hearing Conference:** One or more weeks before the hearing, the ALJ may conduct a telephonic prehearing conference with the parties. During the conference, the ALJ will explore whether the case may be settled, discuss the issues to be litigated and any logistical issues related to the hearing, and attempt to resolve or narrow outstanding issues, such as disputes relating to subpoenaed witnesses and documents. This conference is usually not recorded, but during the hearing the ALJ or the parties sometimes refer to discussions at the pre-hearing conference. You do not have to wait until the prehearing conference to meet with the other parties to discuss settling this case or any other issues.

II. DURING THE HEARING

The rules pertaining to the Board's hearing procedures are found at Sections 102.34 through 102.43 of the Board's Rules and Regulations. Please note in particular the following:

- **Witnesses and Evidence:** At the hearing, you will have the right to call, examine, and cross-examine witnesses and to introduce into the record documents and other evidence.
- **Exhibits:** Each exhibit offered in evidence must be provided in duplicate to the court reporter and a copy of each of each exhibit should be supplied to the ALJ and each party when the exhibit is offered in evidence. If a copy of any exhibit is not available when the original is received, it will be the responsibility of the party offering such exhibit to submit the copy to the ALJ before the close of hearing. If a copy is not


submitted, and the filing has not been waived by the ALJ, any ruling receiving the exhibit may be rescinded and the exhibit rejected.

- **Transcripts:** An official court reporter will make the only official transcript of the proceedings, and all citations in briefs and arguments must refer to the official record. The Board will not certify any transcript other than the official transcript for use in any court litigation. Proposed corrections of the transcript should be submitted, either by way of stipulation or motion, to the ALJ for approval. Everything said at the hearing while the hearing is in session will be recorded by the official reporter unless the ALJ specifically directs off-the-record discussion. If any party wishes to make off-the-record statements, a request to go off the record should be directed to the ALJ.
- **Oral Argument:** You are entitled, on request, to a reasonable period of time at the close of the hearing for oral argument, which shall be included in the transcript of the hearing. Alternatively, the ALJ may ask for oral argument if, at the close of the hearing, if it is believed that such argument would be beneficial to the understanding of the contentions of the parties and the factual issues involved.
- **Date for Filing Post-Hearing Brief:** Before the hearing closes, you may request to file a written brief or proposed findings and conclusions, or both, with the ALJ. The ALJ has the discretion to grant this request and to will set a deadline for filing, up to 35 days.

III. AFTER THE HEARING

The Rules pertaining to filing post-hearing briefs and the procedures after the ALJ issues a decision are found at Sections 102.42 through 102.48 of the Board's Rules and Regulations. Please note in particular the following:

- **Extension of Time for Filing Brief with the ALJ:** If you need an extension of time to file a post-hearing brief, you must follow Section 102.42 of the Board's Rules and Regulations, which requires you to file a request with the appropriate chief or associate chief administrative law judge, depending on where the trial occurred. You must immediately serve a copy of any request for an extension of time on all other parties and furnish proof of that service with your request. You are encouraged to seek the agreement of the other parties and state their positions in your request.
- **ALJ's Decision:** In due course, the ALJ will prepare and file with the Board a decision in this matter. Upon receipt of this decision, the Board will enter an order transferring the case to the Board and specifying when exceptions are due to the ALJ's decision. The Board will serve copies of that order and the ALJ's decision on all parties.
- **Exceptions to the ALJ's Decision:** The procedure to be followed with respect to appealing all or any part of the ALJ's decision (by filing exceptions with the Board), submitting briefs, requests for oral argument before the Board, and related matters is set forth in the Board's Rules and Regulations, particularly in Section 102.46 and following sections. A summary of the more pertinent of these provisions will be provided to the parties with the order transferring the matter to the Board.
