MOTION TO DISMISS WITHOUT PREJUDICE THE BOARD’S  
APPLICATION FOR SUMMARY ENTRY OF A JUDGMENT  
ENFORCING THE BOARD’S ORDER

To the Honorable, the Judges of the United States  
Court of Appeals for the Third Circuit:

Pursuant to Federal Rule of Appellate Procedure 42(b), the National Labor Relations Board (“the Board”), by its Acting Deputy Associate General Counsel, respectfully moves to dismiss, without prejudice, the Board’s application for enforcement in the above-captioned case, and shows:

1. The Board’s application for summary entry of a judgment enforcing an order of the National Labor Relations Board against Able Building Maintenance and its successor Empire Facility Solutions, LLC (“Respondents”) in the above-captioned case (No. 19-2512), was docketed on July 9, 2019. To date no appearance on behalf of Respondents has been filed in this matter.

2. One of the respondents in this action, Able Building Maintenance (“Able”), has fully complied with the Board’s order. Efforts to obtain compliance from respondent Empire Facility Solutions, LLC (“Empire”) continue. The Board now seeks to withdraw its application for summary entry of judgment without prejudice to the Board’s right to file a future enforcement application, in the event that Able fails to comply with the Board’s ongoing cease and desist obligation or the Board is unable to obtain compliance from Empire. *See NLRB v. Mexia Textile Mills*, 339 U.S. 563, 567 (1950) (because “[a] Board order imposes a continuing obligation” and because “the Board is entitled to have [any] resumption of the unfair practice barred by an enforcement decree,” an employer’s compliance does not deprive the Board of the right to secure enforcement of the order from an appropriate court); *NLRB v. Raytheon Co.*, 398 U.S. 25, 27-28 (1970) (same).

3. Accordingly, the Board seeks to withdraw its application, without prejudice, each side to bear its own costs.

WHEREFORE, the Board requests that the Clerk enter an order dismissing without prejudice the above captioned case, each side to bear its own costs.
