The Respondent respectfully requests an additional 25 pages to the standard 50-page limit, for a total of 75 pages, for its brief in support of its exceptions to the Administrative Law Judge's decision. The additional pages are necessary to respond to the numerous allegations and issues in the case.

Litigating the case took a full two weeks. The total length of the transcript is 1,688 pages and there were 353 pages of exhibits. The total record is thus more than 2,000 pages long. There are 18 allegations that were not dismissed or withdrawn. Many of these 18 allegations require more than the less than two and half pages that could be devoted to each allegation with the standard 50-page limit.

The additional pages are necessary to adequately explain the Respondent's position and to adequately respond to factual errors and case law that the Administrative Law Judge raised that was not raised by the General Counsel. Much of the case law that was raised is superseded by case law from the Board and was not addressed at the briefing stage. Moreover, there are additional procedural issues regarding the General Counsel's late amendment of four of the allegations after the close of testimony by witnesses from all parties.

Therefore, Boar's Head respectfully requests permission for an additional 25 pages within its brief supporting the exceptions that it plans to file in the case.
